VÁCLAV HAVEL AIRPORT PRAGUE HANDLES OVER 50 SPECIAL CARGO FLIGHTS IN A MONTH

It has been more than a month since the first flight with medical supplies on board landed at Václav Havel Airport Prague during the current COVID-19 pandemics. Since that time, we have already handled more than 50 special bringing the much-needed medical aid to the Czech Republic. At the same time, 33 repatriation flights have departed from or landed in Prague. They allowed over 4,500 passengers to travel back home to their families and loved ones. All that could only happen thanks to the endless effort and dedication of all employees, firefighters, police and military officers and others. They deserve a big appreciation for their willingness to stay working at the airport every day, day or night, on the front line.

INFORMATION ABOUT MEASURES APPLIED BY THE CZECH GOVERNMENT



We would like to inform you of loosening of selected preventive measures connected with the COVID-19 pandemic, announced by the Government of the Czech Republic in recent days. As of Monday, 27 April 2020, the rules for crossing state borders have been

MARCH OPERATING RESULTS AFFECTED BY BORDER RESTRICTIONS AND DECLINING AIR TRAVEL DEMAND



Václav Havel Airport Prague remains open for all arrivals and departures. According to current statistics, a total of 434,719 passengers passed through the airport in March 2020, which represents a year-on-year decrease of 64.7%. Compared to

aircraft movements decreased by 47.3%.

The last month's overall operating results were affected by the measures applied at both the borders of the Czech Republic and abroad and also affected by the declining demand for air travel around the world. In the first half of March 2020, a number of regular scheduled direct routes were still in operation, while in the second half of the month, traffic on regular connections slowed down significantly. However, special cargo and repatriation flights continue to head to Prague, and operations remain unchanged on regular direct routes to Minsk and Sofia.
